VISIONING THE NEXT GENERATION

As we continue to see new families registering as members of our St. Jude family, as we see discussions of potentially new housing developments within our parish boundaries and as we anticipate being twinned with

another parish in the future (with a potential reduction in Masses) it is critical that we continue to plan to meet the worship needs of future generations. Toward that end, we have been meeting with Sheerr Mc Crystal Paulson (Architects) and developing plans to expand our existing church. Our objective is to add seating for 200 additional worshippers, provide essential structural repairs, and bring the existing church up to current building codes while maintaining a typical "New England" ambiance to the worship space. We will develop several options while working aggressively to provide "cost effective", achievable construction costs. Once plans have been developed, we will hold a meeting designed to inform the parish of options and to also receive your questions, concerns and advice. Fr. Bob

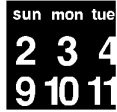
